



# William L. "Bill" Krueger

## Rest in Peace

William L. "Bill" Krueger was born May 8, 1941, in Woodstock, Illinois. He passed away January 13, 2017, in Reggio di Calabria, Italy. He is preceded in death by his wife, Barbara Sue Krueger (nee Golladay); his parents, Leroy and Gracia Krueger; and his sisters, Judith Kranz and Cynthia Sue Bailey. He is survived by his sister-in-law and brother-in-law, Nancy and Kenneth Lebermann of Bentonville, Arkansas; his four children, Eric L. "Skip" Krueger of Lewisville, Heather Lee Krueger of El Paso, Reed William Krueger of Athens, and Leland Travis Krueger of Denton; four grandchildren; two nieces and four nephews; several cousins; and his long-time companion Louisa Weigler, as well as her family.

While Bill was born in Illinois, he grew up in San Francisco, California. It was there that he met his high school sweetheart, Barbara Sue Golladay, whom he later married on July 6, 1963. They lived in Menlo Park, California, and Bill was one of the early generation of computer experts from that area. In 1969, Bill and several friends and colleagues moved their families to the Dallas area to form a high-tech company. While the company did not prosper, Bill and Barbara did with their growing family in Richardson. As comfortable working on the hardware side of computers as the software side, Bill spent his lifetime working in high-tech companies of one sort or another, and earned his bachelors of applied science from Southern Methodist University in 1981 with support from Texas Instruments. Bill and Barbara raised their four children in Richardson, and Bill remained in the same house until his passing. Bill was proud to celebrate the college commencement of all four of his children, and enjoyed the love of four grandchildren. Barbara preceded Bill in death in 2004 due to a brain aneurism, and her remains lay in rest at Roselawn Cemetery in Denton, Texas.

In his later years, Bill found great joy spending more time with his life-long hobby of HAM radio operations and with camping with friends. He also developed a strong and loving companionship with long-time cherished family friend Louisa Weigler. With Louisa, Bill found a spiritual home at Highland Park Presbyterian Church, and participated in numerous activities sponsored by the church. Bill and Louisa shared many great travel adventures together. Bill fell and was injured during one of these adventures. After injuring his head, he lay in a coma in Reggio di Calabria, Italy, for almost three months before having a heart attack on January 13, 2017, from which he could not be saved.

He died in the middle of an adventure, enjoying and exploring the world, having lived a rich and fulfilling life. Bill's remains will join Barbara's at Roselawn Cemetery.
